Each day the Red Cross should penetrate further into the hearts of men. If it is genuinely intended that the Red Cross should be an effetive factor in promoting peace in the world, it must be not only a doctrine but a living reality awakening the conscience of all and providing instruction for all from their early years.

Things are liked more when you are in close contact with them. Love is not a spontaneous feeling. It is a physical process which takes hold of our being through experiencing sympathy, reciprocity, friendship, understanding... and if the Red Cross is love of mankind, this feeling will grow provided you take the trouble to get to know this institution of a universal character ever better.

One of the means which we propose to ensure letter dissemination of what the Red Cross signifies and really is, is the RED CROSS ALBUM, which is specially intended for youth from primary school to university. Everyone knows how keen an interest youth takes in collecting stamps to fill an album. There can be no disputing the successes achieved in this field by various companies which make use of stamps to help sell their product. Hence the proposed publication of the album is basically intended as an educational project, which also, however, constitutes a source of revenue for programmes of assistance successfully carried out by the youth of different contries.

The album might contain 200 to 300 stamps, depending upon the particular aims of the various National Societies.

For example, the Mexican Red Cross intends to publish in the near future an album containing 300 stamps under the following headings:

- V- Florence Nightingale, the pioneer of modern nursing
