WHAT OUR WEBSITE OFFERS

With a few clicks on familylinks.icrc.org you can find out:

- how we look for separated family members
- how we help restore contact between them
- how we help reunite families

The website also tells you how you can contact the right people at the Red Cross or Red Crescent in your country to receive help. In large-scale emergencies, we may launch an online tracing service where:

- you can find names of people who are safe and people who are missing
- you can register to let others know that you are safe
- you can register the names of relatives with whom you have lost contact

HOW THE WEBSITE WORKS

It's easy to use – follow these steps:

- Visit the website familylinks.icrc.org
- Simply enter the country in which you are and the country in which your family member might be.

The website will tell you:

- under what circumstances you can make a request and what services are offered in a specific country
- who will be able to help you in the country where you are
- who will look for your family member in the country where that person might be

It will give you the address and phone numbers of the Red Cross or Red Crescent Society in your country.

If you want help, you can contact the Red Cross or Red Crescent Society or the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) in the country where you live by phone or mail or by filling out a contact form on the website.

The Red Cross or Red Crescent Society in your country or the ICRC will help you personally.


WE HELP RESTORE CONTACT BETWEEN FAMILY MEMBERS

Every year, thousands of family members are separated by conflicts, disasters or migration. People suffer terribly when they lose contact with their loved ones and don't know where they are or whether they are safe.

THE RED CROSS AND RED CRESCENT FAMILY LINKS NETWORK

Who we are and what we do:

- The ICRC and 188 National Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies together form a humanitarian network that endeavours to restore family links across the world in order to alleviate human suffering.
 - We are strictly impartial, neutral and independent.
 - The ICRC supports, guides, and coordinates the efforts of National Societies to help separated families.
 - For more than 100 years, we have been helping people find family members and restoring contact between them and their loved ones.
- After the 2010 earthquake in Haiti, 6,400 people used the ICRC website to let their families know that they were alive and well. Family members registered the names of 23,000 loved ones whom they were looking for. Using satellite phones, we helped restore contact between 3,300 persons and their families. 27 children were reunited with their parents.
- In the context of the 2011 crisis in Libya, the Red Cross and Red Crescent helped over 100,000 people restore contact with their families in over 70 countries.

National Societies and the ICRC increasingly provide family-links services in the context of migration, for instance in the Americas and between Africa and Europe.

WE ARE HERE TO HELP YOU

The new website familylinks.icrc.org gives you key information on how we can help find a member of your family. It enables you to access the trusted services of the Red Cross and Red Crescent wherever you are.

It is a reliable website, backed by specialists from the Red Cross and Red Crescent around the world who will help you on a personal basis.



In 2011, together with National Societies, the ICRC distributed over 127,000 family messages and facilitated close to 220,000 phone calls between relatives, helping them to get in touch with each other or to remain in contact. It also reunited 1,500 children with their families.
