Abstract:	This article examines the differences in applying the United States Department of Defense (DoD) Law of War Manual and the ICRC Interpretive Guidance on the notion of direct participation in hostilities approach to targeting under Article 13 of Additional Protocol II. The Manual and the Interpretive Guidance are consistent on the principle of civilians' direct participation in hostilities (DPH), but vary significantly in application, requiring U.S. military forces to have a collective understanding of the nuanced differences in order to work with coalition partners. The article analyzes issues for judge advocates to consider when working with coalition force judge advocates in a specific targeting scenario.
